School Uniform Policy

Dress Code: Y12 & Y13

The style for sixth form students is about appearance and attitude. Students are expected to dress and behave in accordance with a place of work.

Boys Uniform

- Suit comprising matching or co-ordinated trousers, jacket and buttoned shirt.
- Tie optional.
- Appropriate formal shoes.

Girls Uniform

- Formal trousers or skirt; the skirt being not too short or tight and closer to the knee than mid-thigh. It should also not be of stretchy material and/or contain Lycra.
- Blouses/shirts/smart business tops.
- A fitted suit jacket.
- Appropriate formal shoes.

The following **may not be worn** by boys or girls:

- Outdoor coats in lessons or around the school building.
- Jeans or denim style clothing or tracksuit/leggings.
- T-shirts and hoodies.
- Studs in clothing.
- Revealing tops.
- Trainers, casual shoes, flip flops, sandals or boots.
- Hats.

Jewellery, Hair and Make-Up

Jewellery: discrete with no facial piercings. Tattoos and fake tan are not allowed. Discrete make-up is acceptable.

Hair: we promote traditional hair styles with no extreme styling. Please note, that if students dye their hair, only natural colours may be used. Boys and girls **are not permitted** to come into school with lines or patterns shaved into their hair or eye brows.

Where students arrive at school wearing uniform that does not meet our uniform regulations, parents will be contacted with an expectation that the uniform is changed.

The decision of the Principal and Head of Sixth Form are final with respect to dress code.

Our 6th Form Dress Code

Males to wear:
Suit comprising trousers, jacket and buttoned shirt. Tie optional. Appropriate formal shoes.



Females to wear:
Formal trousers/skirt (not too short or too tight, closer to the knee than mid-thigh)
Plain blouse/shirt
A fitted suit jacket.
Appropriate formal shoes.



Jewellery and make up should be discrete. No facial piercings or extreme hairstyles.

No outdoor coats to be worn in lessons or around the school building.

No Jeans or denim style clothing or tracksuits/leggings

No T shirts or hoodies
No studs in clothing.



No revealing tops

No trainers, casual shoes, flip flops, sandals or boots.

No hats
